A LETTER TO LASALLE PLAZA TENANTS

I am pleased to announce the relocation of the Minneapolis Corporate office of Zeller Realty Group (ZRG) to LaSalle Plaza. The corporate employees have joined the LaSalle Plaza management team in our new location on the 9th floor in Suite 950. I have included a picture of the entire staff below and if you have an opportunity please stop by our new office for a tour.

First, I would like to welcome several new tenants to the building. They are Playtex Products, Philips Electronics and Roepke Public Relations located on the 9th floor and Hamilton Beach, Mars US and Imagine!Print Solutions which are located on the 10th floor. Since the purchase of LaSalle Plaza by Zeller Realty Group we have completed several capital projects in the building. Common corridor upgrades have been completed on the 9th and 10th floors with the 12th floor scheduled to be completed at the end of August.

Concrete and expansion joint replacement has been completed in the parking garage and the loading dock with traffic membrane replacement scheduled to occur on August 24th, 25th and 26th. LaSalle Plaza Recycling



The messages are everywhere these days—reduce, reuse, recycle. Many businesses are pursuing ways to be resource conscious, and are often finding it's cost-effective. LaSalle Plaza offers you an easy way to recycle.

The recycling program at LaSalle Plaza is designed to encourage people to become active recyclers and is simple. Since a lot of trash items are generated in break rooms and restrooms, the waste receptacles in these areas are considered trash. Items considered to be waste include styrofoam and paper cups, food wrappers and containers, pizza boxes, food, tissues, napkins, batteries (AA, 9-volt, etc.), ream or copy machine paper wrappers, overnight envelopes, rest room wastes, and miscellaneous office products. In addition to waste receptacles in the break rooms we have recycling containers to collect recyclable items such as plastic bottles, aluminum and tin cans, and glass bottles.

Of the recyclable items collected in the building, office paper creates the most volume. Office paper is collected in the container at your desk or in the break rooms. This includes all types of paper, letter head, post-it-notes, reports, copier paper, stationary, phone message slips, junk mail, newspaper, magazines and newsletters, envelopes with or without windows, brochures, carbonless forms, etc.

Our recycling company, Rohn Industries, requires that the waste put into the desk side receptacles must contain at least 90 percent recyclable material. When large amounts of waste are put in recyclable bins, it can contaminate everything, causing all of the contents to be treated as trash, so it is important not to throw your lunch or other waste items in your desk side container.

The materials in the recycling containers are collected by the cleaning crew and brought down to the loading dock. From there, Rohn Industries takes the recyclable material to its recycling in Saint Paul, where the material is inspected and sorted for baling or direct shipment to be recycled into various products.

The following amounts of recyclable materials were generated at LaSalle Plaza during the first half of 2007:

- 55,500 pounds of plastic and glass bottles
- 75,680 pounds of cardboard
- 120,617 pounds of office paper
- 1,408 pounds of phone books
- 2,600 pounds of pop cans

The recycling of cardboard, office paper, and phone books helps reduce the number of trees that would be harvested to make these items from raw materials. (See the Trivia Quiz in the sidebar.)

Another benefit of recycling is less tax for the office building. In Minnesota, there is a 31 percent tax on trash, and no tax on recyclables.
